Pastor's Perspective

It's exciting to have our core values, beliefs, vision and mission on paper and before us.

(see p. ?) Many of you have helped to shape these in recent months. Providing leadership in this discussion, now several years old, have been Paul Cook, Gail Wickman, 30 members meeting at St Joe's last April, Gail Buchanan, church staff, deacons, elders, Presbyterian Men and Women, and most recently, the Project Planning Team of Reid Kennedy, Ruth Rosenow, Dave Gordon and, Barb and Gary Shorrel. Also, we thank the transformation team that met through last spring and summer.

We believe that these Values, Beliefs, Vision and Mission (VBVM) reflect the emerging core identity of our congregation. What we do at First Presbyterian in ministry and mission will be inspired and evaluated by this document. We invite you to pour over the statement, pray over it, and begin to make it yours. The session and staff are already doing so.

While a lot has been accomplished, we have really only just begun. Many of our ideas and plans have been put aside until this was accomplished. The foundation for future ministry and mission is now in place. Praise God!

The exciting challenge for me, as your pastor, is to support your spiritual development so that you may grow into even more effective ministers and leaders. This involves teaching, coaching, and encouraging, both individually and in small groups.

Several ideas for faith formation and growth have been discussed in recent months – many of them creating opportunities for small group development. For example, a group meeting to discuss The Heart of Christianity by Marcus Borg or the Shack by Wm. Paul Young; a group for couples to share their experiences with The Love Dare or with date nights – perhaps creating a few date nights to share together. Somebody suggested forming a group around the Ten Commandments, looking at them one-by-one, really delving into their meaning for our society and our personal lives. There are wonderful small group guides that help us address issues of concern for all of us – ranging from loving justice to spiritual gifts, from End Times to Christian character. A group could gather in their desire to Know Jesus. After all, our vision is to *meet Jesus*. Have you really met Jesus? Or are you more of an acquaintance? We can become more adept in our conversations with Jesus, and happily share our trust and hope in Jesus with others. Let me know if any of these or other ideas seem like something you would like to explore.

The green Transformation Newsletter will continue to come mid-month and keep you apprised of our progress. Be sure to check the website www.fpcchippewafalls.net for a regularly updated church calendar. In November or early December, we will be welcoming several new members. Soon we will begin to plan our budget for 2009.

Money talks...

OOPS! In the letter that you received with your 3rd quarter statement I said that no money had been spent on mission (line 5323). Not so. Beginning in August we have been paying \$2000 per month for our denominational missions. We expect to pay that amount through the end of the year.

In October we made our **final per capita payment** to the Presbytery of Northern Waters. We paid a total of \$6020 this year which is \$25 per confirmed member. The members contributed \$3149 of this amount leaving \$2871 to come out of other income sources. If you still have not paid your per capita, please consider doing so. There's still time.
